# FIRST GRADE - JEREMY ROWE

To The MCUE Faithful, We travelled to Cross Roads Oval to do battle with a familiar foe in Collingullie GP. The Demons were coming off a big win and had recently welcome back key personnel and deserved our respect for these reasons. We were aware that we had the bye following and we had not been particularly happy with the week previous so we put plenty of time and effort in to making sure that we were somewhere near our best for this occasion. Our first quarter was full of promise and we generated plenty of scoring opportunities. Our defensive intent was much, much better than the week previous and this was particularly pleasing as it was our major area of focus following from the Turvey game. We also bought a notable amount of energy, our attack on the contest was extreme and we created manic defensive pressure when we didn't have footy in hand. Most of these behaviors continued in to the second quarter as we continued to get the ball inside 50 as a regular occurrence. Apart from some inaccuracy in front of goal, the half time score line was a good one and it read 6.8 to 1.4. The conversation during the half time break centered around being more effective when we bought the ball forward. The onus was on both the ball carrier and the players further ahead of the footy to share this responsibility and create a better outcome by being predictable to each other by providing and honoring the options that we regularly practice. The feeling was that if we fixed this issue and continued with our more promising behaviors then we could find another level and come away with a large victory. Unfortunately the 3rd quarter was almost the exact opposite of what we wanted. Gullie came out firing and had notably lifted their intensity and we failed to lift with them. We fumbled, we panicked in front of goal and we became reactive and Gullie kicked 5.1 to our 0.6 to put themselves right back into the contest. Thankfully our players responded in a positive sense in the last quarter and we were able to contribute 5.3 in what was our best quarter for the day and ended up 33 point victors. The 3rd quarter was both disappointing and concerning however upon reflection we can still be happy with many facets of our game. Our defensive efforts on the turnover were terrific, our structure and performance around the stoppage was much improved, we ran hard from behind and handballed with width, all of which are positive parts of our play and make up a large part of our game style. We generated 28 scoring shots, we won 3 of 4 quarters, we kept our opponent to 1 goal or less in 3 of the 4 quarters and we responded when challenged. We push very high standards within our group but we can't expect the team to be perfect and we must understand that our opponent also has a say in what goes on between the hours of 2pm – 5pm on a Saturday. We don't walk away satisfied but we should all walk away optimistic that our best footy isn't far around the corner. On a day where many players put forth a real mixed bag type of performance two of our role players in Chuck Chambers and Pat Killalea stood up and made positive and consistent contributions in each quarter to be awarded 5th and 6th best. Jake Hindmarsh had his best game of the season by far, gathering plenty of touches and advancing us down the field by gaining considerable territory while Tom Keogh played a his first full game in the middle and gave a terrific account of himself with 2 goals and many clean possessions throughout the game. Our top 2 were regular mentions in this part of the report being Ethan Schiller and Ryan Turnbull. Ethan's around-ground stoppage work was exceptional and Rab's knocked up getting touches, evading opposition defenders and delivering the ball with composure and certainty. We are back at home this weekend and Leeton are the meat between the bye sandwich. Whilst Leeton have not experienced a great deal of success this season, they are led by one of the best players our competition has seen in sometime and will possibly welcome back some quality personnel after having the double bye. As the hunted, we must be ready to be at our best and continue to make the week to week improvements that we strive for. Our game vs Gullie at the time was the top of the table clash. We went into the game with quiet confidence in our ability, knowing it was going to be a high intensity game with both teams playing with finals-like intensity. I feel our strong start stemmed from our warm up, which was full of purpose and intensity. Unfortunately not long into the first quarter our GA Romy Stephens rolled her ankle which prevented her from continuing the game. On came Kaylah Upfield into GA, who slotted into the fast paced game with ease. The first quarter was competitive and both teams were fairly equally poised in terms of converting their turnovers. But far, this was our best whole team start to any game we have played this season and it was necessary to be in the fight from the start. Through the second quarter hard team defensive work found us more opportunities to convert which gave us a nice half time lead, but not enough to feel safe. The Wallaces kept alive on the circle edge and made use of any crafty deflections from our circle defenders, whilst also getting some themselves. These 'one percenters' are what great teams need to separate them from other strong sides when skill level is well matched. Shannan Russell and Ruby Gillard had their work cut out for them double teaming strong target GS Hannah Finamore for the whole game, whilst still applying enough pressure on two separate GAs for the game. When team defensive pressure was high, Gullie found it much harder to find clear passage to their target GS. Our captain Mikaela Cole had a dominant game in WA, consistently providing safe passage of the ball to our shooters and particularly through her connection with Ash Reynoldson (GS). Mikaela was receiving centre passes uncontested thanks to her strong off the ball preliminary moves. Ash Reynoldson was a strong target for us and avenue to goal whilst copping a lot of attention from her two separate GKs. Kayla Upfield (GA), played with great intensity and athleticism, whilst potting some impressive long bombs which came down like rain in the final quarter. The goal now is to continue this level of netball on an individual and team level, as the bar has been set for where we can expect ourselves to perform if we want to be at our best each week.
