To The MCUE Faithful, After a well-earned break over the long weekend we were back at it out at The Plah. We welcomed Leeton who we acknowledge are in a development season but we were always going to offer them respect as they have some star players at the top end of their list and had put in some performances that showed they could hang in there with teams above them on the ladder. In the early stages our intensity was down, as was our defensive intent. This was disappointing as we had freshened up over the bye and we were looking for more energy in the initial stages.
