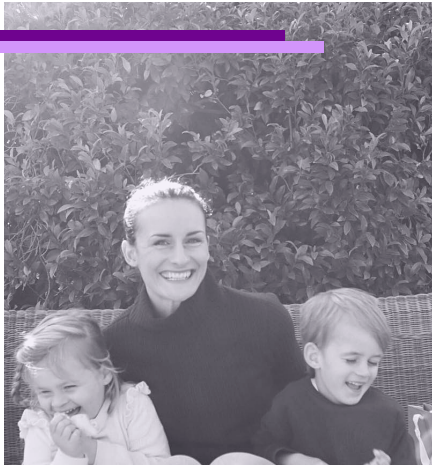

Charlie and Zara Millar both have A-T and their parents Carly & Jeff have been big advocates in the fight to find a cure.

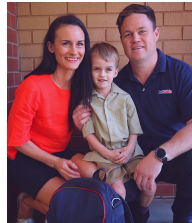

To The MCUE Faithful, We travelled to Griffith to tackle the Swans and the longest road trip in the competition. The ladder showed it was a case of top vs bottom but we knew that Griffith were a different beast at home and we were ready to put forth a performance that not only got the 'W' but kept us rolling forward on our quest for continuous improvement. We jumped out of the blocks in fine fashion as we were first to the footy, used the footy well and importantly brought the ball inside 50 cleanly and clinically. Our defensive intent and use of 'bumper bars' was pleasing and when 2nd gamer, Zac Hanrahan, kicked the first senior goal of his career the group were up and about as we went into the break happy with what we had achieved but keen for more. Our second quarter was very pleasing with more of the same from the first with the added layer of releasing our good ball users via hands with width and letting them do their thing. After 15 minutes of toil, Alex McCormack pushed forward for a rare goal and we finished the quarter with a flurry, coming in at half time with the score reading 8.6.54 to 1.4.10. DON'T HAVE A BLUE WITH MANGOPLAH!

Two of the clubs with the longest and most "colourful" histories in Riverina football meet today in a game which could well determine the finishing order of finalists in this year's first grade competition. Mangoplah-Cookardinia United-Eastlakes, top and undefeated, are at home to third-placed Coolamon Rovers. Last time they met, at Coolamon's Kindra Park on 9 May, there was just a straight kick in it at full-time. No other team has gone anywhere near that close to the Goannas this season. But this is not a preview of what may or may not happen this afternoon. Rather, this is a celebration of these two clubs' resolve to stick with tradition. There was a time – and it seems like only yesterday but it was 36 years ago – when the powers that be who then ran football deemed it necessary for all country clubs to conform to Victorian Football League standard jumpers, shorts and socks. And so a stern missive went out to this effect from Melbourne. Clubs which failed to comply would even face fines. Locally, the Victorian Country Football League had in its sights Ardlethan (red and gold stripes), Aria Park-Mirrool (brown, green trim, gold APM lettering), Boree Creek (black and white bands), Coolamon (green, white V), MCU (blue and gold bands), Narrandera (blue, gold V), Rivcoll (red and white stripes), South Wagga-Tolland (red, black V) and Uranquinty (green, red V). Of those, Ardlethan and APM merged in 2004 to become the Northern Jets and wear Port Adelaide's black, teal and white strip, Boree Creek (last played 1986), South Wagga-Tolland (1997) and Uranquinty (1998) all eventually folded whilst Narrandera succumbed for a time, donning West Coast's outfit and also changing its traditional Imperials moniker to the Eagles.

Narrandera played in the West Coast design in its 2005 and '07 senior grand finals but had reverted to its blue with a gold V when it last won a flag in 2012. Rivcoll, now called Charles Sturt University, continues to turn out in the design it first wore in 1972. That leaves Mangoplah (formed in 1913) and Coolamon, which was founded in 1894 ... three years even before the VFL! There was no way the officials of either of these proud clubs were going to be told what to do or what to wear ... sanctions or no sanctions. Their colours were their colours, the jumper designs were staying put and that was that! MCU probably put it best. In a lengthy letter to VCFL secretary Mark Patterson, MCU secretary Peter Matthews said the club had absolutely no intention of changing its uniform for the VCFL nor anyone else and "we will not pay any fines imposed upon us by whoever for non-compliance". In other words ... go and take a running jump! Mangoplah had worn its famous hoops from the outset. Mangoplah merged with Cookardinia after the 1954 Albury and District League season and in 1998 added Eastlakes (formed as a Turvey Park and District Midget League club in 1978) but has always worn blue and gold bands. Cookardinia, formed in 1909, wore navy blue with a red V whilst Eastlakes' juniors wore white with a red V. It was a schoolteacher, Darcy Meek, who came up with Mangoplah's design because, of all things, it had been his old Rugby team's colours! More than likely that Union club was Sydney University Football Club which dates back to 1863 – Australia's first Rugby club and which, like its fellow student Australian Rules club (which began in 1887) still wears blue and gold hoops. Regardless, in 1985 MCU was not changing more than 70 years of history because Melbourne said so. No way! "We totally reject your assertion that the move is being made for the benefit of football and suggest it is being made to further centralise power and decision making within the VCFL," Mr Matthews thundered. "In the long term it will not mean cheaper merchandise for clubs; in fact it will almost certainly become dearer, as firstly the royalties paid to the VCFL by the manufacturer will have to be passed on to the consumer (club) and secondly reduced competition will inevitably lead to reduced bargaining power and thus higher prices. "Should the VCFL royalties be paid on a percentage basis, the VCFL would, in fact, have a vested interest in higher prices."

Mr Matthews said at the time the effect would be, and MCU had no doubt the VCFL intended it to be, to force leagues into meek submission to the directives of the VCFL, both through the imposition of fines and, more significantly, the conditional reallocation of collected royalties back to those bodies which "toed the line". "We submit that the best interests of football will be served by the preservation and encouragement of autonomy in local authorities and not by further centralisation of power in the 'ivory towers' of the VCFL," Mr Matthews fumed. He told Mr Patterson the VCFL directive regarding jumpers had been received and noted by MCU "with disbelief, dismay and considerable anger". Mr Patterson, as I recall, was a highly professional administrator who was, in every respect, just doing his job. But the VCFL's jumper demand was overreach, no question about it. MCU was assertive off the field and successful on it in that signature year of 1985, winning its first Farrer League premiership since 1972, brushing aside Collingullie-Ashmont 16.14 (110) to 10.10 (70) in a memorable grand final under the guidance of the late, great Greg Leech. So today, when the teams – seniors or juniors – run out for any of the games on this historic gala Sunday at mighty Mangoplah, give them an extra honk on the car horn for staying true to tradition and winning the day. May the blue and gold and the green and white grace our football ovals for another hundred years and more and may capital city authorities understand you cannot tell country people what to do and expect to get away with it!

The Wallace sisters (Pheobe Wallace in C), were again masterful at shutting down Griffith's centre pass receive to the WA and contributed to some great turnovers from their intense pressure. 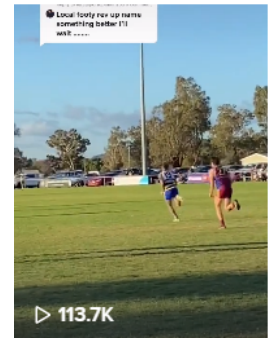
