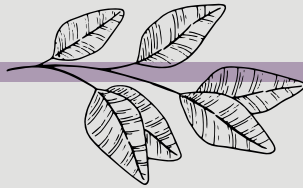

To The MCUE Faithful, After a couple of victories against developing teams, it was time to test ourselves against a fellow contender. Looking from the outside in, it was clear that Gullie had been operating at high standards and we were very excited to lock horns with a club on top of their game. We hadn't lost to Gullie since 2018 and we were welcoming key players back which gave us plenty of confidence that we could get the job done.

Unfortunately, despite showing genuine hunger and ball winning ability, the skill level we showed in the first quarter was sub standard to say the least. After 10 turn overs by foot, we were chasing our tails and the Gullie players and we came in 3 goals down. The score board margin was not of concern but after generating so many opportunities and squandering them with poor execution, we had plenty of work to do to get back in the game. Again, we won plenty of footy on the second quarter but due to some poor defensive efforts and a continued lack of composure and poise with ball in hand, we were outscored again and found ourselves 29 points down at the main break.

The margin was steadily getting away from us, but we were winning so much of the contested and loose footy that we still believed that we were right in the game and just needed to fix our deficiencies with general ball handling and forward 50 entries. Despite being able to tidy up our field kicking, we still butchered the ball going forward. Rather than lowering the eyes and spotting up a target, we bombed away to 1 v 2 or 1 v 3 situations and could not gain any traction in the forward 3rd of the ground. There is no doubt that we continued to fight, we continued to compete, and we never gave up but without crisp ball use and predictable ball movement patterns this was all to no avail and we were defeated by 28 points at the final siren. Our win/loss ratio was now 4 and 3.

Upon reviewing the stats, this performance was particularly frustrating. We had more disposals, more marks, won more contested footy and won more loose balls than Gullie – these stats show how wasteful we were with ball in hand and reflect a wasted opportunity to win such a big game.

On a day where it was difficult to find 4 quarter contributors, Ethan Schiller was clean and damaging when in the middle while Nick Collins worked his backside off for 34 disposals off half back. Ryan Turnbull just kept running and he was rewarded with 34 disposals also. We welcomed back Dom Bunyan after a 4-week injury and he was terrific in his return, organising the backline, taking 5 intercept marks and amassing 21 disposals, all the while being strong defensively from the back pocket.

Pat Killalea was second best on the day, performing an incredibly important defensive role on Ed Perryman. PK was workman like, leading the 1% ers but also provided his share of offense with 17 touches from defence. Best on Ground for the day was Max Hanrahan who battled vigorously from his key defensive post. Max took 5 intercept marks and won or halved many contests throughout the afternoon. Max also took on the job of playing on Sam Stening from quarter time and despite Stening kicking 3 goals over those 3 quarters, it did not reflect the amount of contests Max won or lowered his influence in during this period of time.

Reading above, you will note that I have stated that we are one of the seasons 'contenders'. The team and I are well aware that we have been nowhere near our best to this point of the season and we know we have a long way to go to achieve the 'status' of being a premierships contender. This being said, as a group, we are not shying away from our goals, and we are working as hard as possible to get back to the level we know that we can play at. We have now enjoyed a 2 week freshen up. These 2 weeks were used to freshen up mentally, but we have worked very hard physically during this time. We play Turvey at home this weekend and to say this game is a must win, is an absolute understatement. I am confident this situation will bring out the best in the lads and I can't wait for 2pm, Saturday to roll around.
