Well, what a month it's been!

We saw some really positive behaviours in the Griffith game. We mount huge come backs against Tigers and GGGM to build belief in the group. We travel to Coolamon, lead from start to finish and knock off a top 3 side on their own dunghill. Momentum built; corner turned.

Back tracking a week, we welcomed GGGM to Mangoplah. We were riding a high from our 7 goal last quarter come back against the Tigers and we hoped we would see that momentum flow into what was always going to be a difficult test against the top of the table Lions.

In a game where we felt we dominated possession and territory, we still laboured when bringing the ball inside 50 and wasted opportunities in front of goal. In a spectacular last quarter, our 4th quarter specialist Max Hanrahan stood up and again and kicked 3 goals and along with many other high quality and desperate efforts from all our lads, we had pulled off another stunning victory - this time by 6 points.

James Scott jumped hard & competed harder to draw even in a critical contest against the best ruckman in the Riverina whilst our quiet achiever, Chuck Chambers went about his business in high quality fashion with 23 possession at a high efficiency rate. Nelson Foley was a clearance beast, hit the scoreboard and gave us a hard edge with 24 possessions and Nick Collins operated at the high standards we've become accustomed to with 27 possessions and a number of telling contests, particularly in the air. This left our BOG to Ethan Schiller who was by far the best player on the ground. Ethan amassed 37 possessions in an incredible display of work rate, clean first touch and line breaking football.

Going against the breeze, the second term was always going to be match defining and whilst we still had our issues with ball in hand, we competed in an admirable manner and it was the Goannas up 4 points at the main break. Going to the scoring end in the 3rd, we primed ourselves for a big 3rd quarter and our Mangoplah Men responded in terrific fashion. We ran hard, stood up in big moments, won important contests and had 18 players all contributing when the game called upon them and we cashed in on the scoreboard with a term that reflected 22 - 1.

Despite being confident going in to the last, we knew from our own experiences the game wasn't done and we knew that Coolamon would come at us. With toughness, determination and an unwillingness to be beat, we knuckled down and managed a 19-point victory. In the rooms after the game, there was a notable calm amongst our group. We were excited but put simply, we had performed to a level that we expect. This wasn't one out of the box, this was business as usual and whilst we celebrate this victory, we expect improvement, and we expect many more wins similar to this.

Harry Collins started back and then went into the middle and did what he's done all year – intercepted, rebounded and won big contests. The cherry on top of his game was 2 goals which contributed to a terrific contribution. Brayden Ambler returned to footy, hit up at the ball carrier, showed strong & clean hands and was deadly going inside 50 in a positive return. 3rd and 4th best went to our key backs, Matt Collins & Tim Smith. We are lucky to have such pillars in our key defensive posts and to see them proactively & at times desperately defend Joe Redfern & the in form Will Graetz was a pleasure to watch. 2nd best was our new man on the block, Nelson Foley. In 3 games, it's now hard to imagine an MCUE side without him. Nelson is composed under pressure, provides grunt at the stoppage and hits the scoreboard and it's a privilege to see him do his thing in the Blue & Gold. For the second week in a row, Ethan Schiller was brilliant. Ethan is working harder than anyone else on the field and his ability to take the game on whilst remaining calm and composed was a special part of our performance for the second week in a row. Oh yeah, Eth kicked 2 goals as well!
