We understood that we were vulnerable, but we were determined not to allow vulnerability to transfer into weakness. We have plenty of work to do and it will require determination and full engagement throughout the group to fix our current issues. 3) Our player unavailability's have hit crisis point and we need a change of luck. By the time Bailey Jones went down with a suspected serious knee injury, our player toll went to an absurd 20 of whom are sidelined. It's been a wretched run and I really hope we can see a steady diet of players returning over the next month. On this topic, we wish Bailey all the best with his scans this week and cross our fingers for a positive result. In positive news, we were able to expose some of our young talent to a really high standard of opponent and the reality of first grade football on the weekend.

Congrats to Xavier McDevitt on his first-grade debut. Joining Xave we had, Luke Lawrence (7 games), Flynn Collins (5 games), Bailey Jones (3 games) and Tom Smith (2 games) who are showing that our future is bright when it comes to player development. Matt Collins was superb in the first half, clearly winning his duel against an opponent who had kicked 18 goals in the last 2 weeks before going forward in the 2nd half and giving us a big target that we so dearly needed.



Ryan Turnbull ran himself into the ground for 28 possessions and a well-earned 5th best. James Scott played his second strong game in a row with countless 3rd man in spoils, some intercept marking and composure with the footy and Trent Cohalan continued his incredibly positive start to the 2022 season.

The former represents nothing we want anything to do with whilst the latter represents everything we want to be associated with. Let's see what happens this Saturday.
